Her research focuses on the relationship between wellbeing of fishing communities and coastal governance, with a focus to developing countries. She holds a PhD in Social and Ecological Sustainability from the University of Waterloo and a M.Sc. in Ecology from the University of Campinas, Brazil. Ana Carolina is a co-founder of the Socio-ecological co-creation network for Latin America (RESACA), which is oriented to develop co-creation methodologies to respond to socio-ecological challenges. She collaborates with the Research and outreach group on conservation and management of the commons (CGCommons), University of Campinas, and is a past Institutional Fellow at the Brazilian National Institute for Space Research.
