




Stories from Study Sites




Nine mandalas in Andhra Pradesh - represent Kolleru Lake.

Land Use Map 2012 generated from Landsat 2012.



This board (written in the local language, Telugu) shows that this pond is being used as a source of drinking water. Anyone using this pond for other purposes, like washing animals and bathing, will be fined Rs1000.00.

We saw the Kolleru fishers using these Dhones, braving even the winter chill to venture into the Kolleru for fishing. Most of them use his 'Dhone,' a traditional wooden boat with a wooden oar.
