Shell-Fisheries as a Tool for the Stewardship and Conservation of Mangroves

In Nigeria, data on mangrove use, livelihood dependencies, and the relationship between mangrove fisheries and human well-being is scarce. Recognizing the broad range of users who depend on or benefit from mangroves is crucial to developing adaptive and inclusive management approaches that reflect the interests of all users. The highest stakes for food and nutrition security, and livelihoods, however, are associated with mangrove-dependent shell-fisheries, and this should be the starting point to foster a sense of stewardship and ownership to ensure sustainable mangrove use.

Kafayat Adetoun Fakoya is an interdisciplinary researcher, consultant, and academic. She holds a PhD in fisheries from Lagos State University. Kafayat is a V2V co-investigator and her research focuses on gender, local ecological knowledge, food and nutrition security, aquaculture, small-scale fisheries, fisheries assessments, and seafood sustainability schemes. Kafayat was a case study author and the gender advisor in the Illuminating Hidden Harvests Nigeria small-scale fisheries and led a Gendered Design in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM). In addition, she belongs to several professional networks including the Gender in Aquaculture and Fisheries Section (GAFS), Community Catch, Mundus Maris, and Too Big To Ignore.
