## **Vulnerability, Green Energy and Viability:** A Framework of Intervention for **Resilience and Sustainability**

The talk will focus on several case studies from a recently concluded project on small-scale green energy interventions in coastal India in order to generate novel perspectives on technological innovations and enhance our understanding of the nexus between green energy, resilience and sustainability/viability. The talk aims to propose an initial model for how the emerging insights can be effective in facilitating vulnerability to viability transitions in small-scale fisheries (SSF) communities.

Priyadarshi Patnaik is a professor and former head of the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences and a former chairman at Rekhi Centre of Excellence for the Science of Happiness, Indian Institute of Technology Kharagpur. He is a member of the Advisory Committee of the Kolkata Museum of Modern Arts and a member of the Board of Studies, Kala Bhavan, Viswa Bharati, KIIT and many other universities. His research areas include visual culture and communication, emotions and music, happiness studies and translation studies. As a part of the V2V initiative and DST project on renewable energy, he is the co-lead of the information system working group. He has more than 80 academic papers in national and international peer-reviewed journals and 17 academic and creative writing/edited volumes. He has published poetry, fiction and photographs in international journals. He has been teaching and researching for the last 26 years and has supervised more than 20 PhD and MS students.
